The John Pagett Scholarship	<p>John Pagett (1932-2005) was a man intensely interested in the natural history and archaeology of Shropshire and the West Midlands. He devoted his spare time to engaging with life-long learning in the areas of geology, archaeology, local history, place-name studies and botany in addition to being an accomplished watercolourist. For many years he worked on the excavations at Wroxeter and at Barnsley Park with Dr Graham Webster and then as a volunteer on the Wroxeter Hinterland Project in the mid 1990s. He was also a regular contributor to Margaret Gelling's Shropshire place-name group and on the basis of his work developed a love of Anglo-Saxon literature and language. On his death, he generously bequeathed a third of his estate to the Telford and Wrekin Historical Society (now Wrekin History Group), of whom he was a member.</p>	<p>Those applying to the fund must be carrying out historical, archaeological or natural history research on Shropshire or the immediate region.
