- Prescribing ePACT


#### Important to note:

- Data completeness
- Data validity e.g. high exception reporting in QOF (14.4% for SMI) indicators vs. 4.4% for physical health indicators)
- What the indicators measure e.g. screening vs. treatment






## IAPT referral rates per 100,000 population








## IAPT Access: Patients waiting < 28 days








# Physical Health Checks (QOF): Alcohol








#### Physical Health Checks (QOF): Blood Pressure
