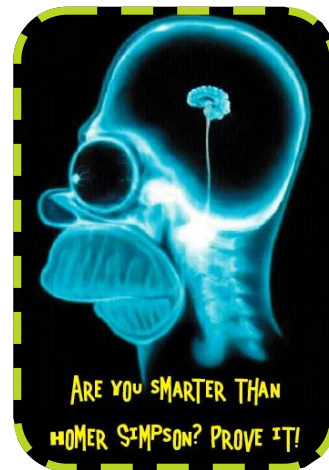
Mondays
