How to reach the University



CATCH THE TRAIN FROM BIRMINGHAM NEW STREET STRAIGHT TO UNIVERSITY STATION IN EIGHT MINUTES

The University has a very limited number of car parking spaces on open days and as the majority of visitors will be unable to park, we strongly recommend where possible, for visitors to use public transport.

By rail

Being the only university in mainland UK with its own station, the easiest way to reach the University is by train. Most cross-country services to Birmingham arrive at Birmingham New Street station and up to six trains an hour depart for University on the cross-city line (final destination Longbridge or Redditch). The journey time usually takes less than ten minutes, while the centre of the main campus is a five-minute walk from University station. Student ambassadors (wearing lime green shirts) will be present at Birmingham New Street station to direct you. Your final destination for purchasing train tickets will be 'University (Birmingham)'.



LIMITED PARKING



Parking on campus

Parking on open days is extremely limited and the majority of visitors will be unable to find a space on campus. We therefore recommend that visitors use public transport to reach the University or find alternative parking in and around the city. The University has three main car parks: North East (B15 2SA), North (B15 2SB) and Pritchatts Car Park (B15 2QU) (free of charge); parking will also be available at the West Car Park (near the Medical School) on Vincent Drive on Saturday only, however please note that these are used by staff and students and fill up very quickly and therefore we cannot guarantee a space for visitors.



PARK AND RIDE

Park and ride

In addition to University parking there is an overspill park and ride car park with some limited parking. This is based at King Edward's School playing field (B29 7JX – the playing fields is a left turn if approaching from the city centre, just before the Eastern Road turn) on the Bristol Road. Park and ride will be operating on a first-come, first-served basis. Shuttle buses to and from the University will be running throughout the day, dropping off and picking up from outside University Centre (building R23 on the map on the back page).

The first park and ride will leave King Edward's School playing field at 8.30am. The last bus will leave University Centre at 4.30pm. There is no charge for the park and ride car park.

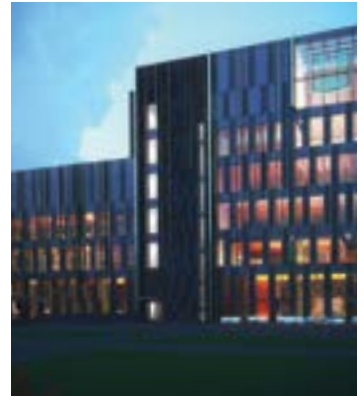
We have even more projects in the pipeline, some of which you will benefit from the minute you start as a University of Birmingham student.

The new sports facility, 360 Sport & Fitness, will open on campus this September. It will be an iconic sporting venue and will feature an exceptional range and quality of facilities including a 50-metre pool, an arena sports hall, 200+ station gym, six squash courts, ten-metre climbing wall, a performance gym and much more! 360 Sport & Fitness will cater for everyone in the student and local community whether you're a beginner or an elite athlete.

Visit our outstanding new library today (also opening later this year), for a sneak preview of the state-of-the-art facilities for all students. Located in the centre of campus, study spaces

in the new library will benefit from stunning views across campus and light and airy areas to work. All study spaces will allow students to work from multiple devices and a variety of flexible spaces will support students in all methods of study, from group work to independent self-study.

The new Green Heart will be a vast landscaped park at the heart of campus, with a range of spaces for activities ranging from ceremonial occasions to public performances. In addition to our new Chamberlain hall of residences, we are creating a new residence for 178 students near our sports pitches at the Selly Oak entrance to campus, while the Collaborative Teaching Laboratory will bring together practical teaching activities across a broad range of science and engineering disciplines.

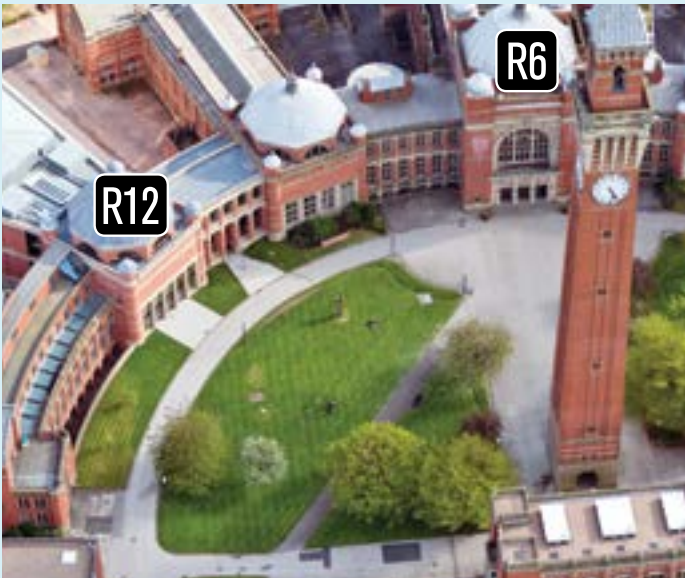

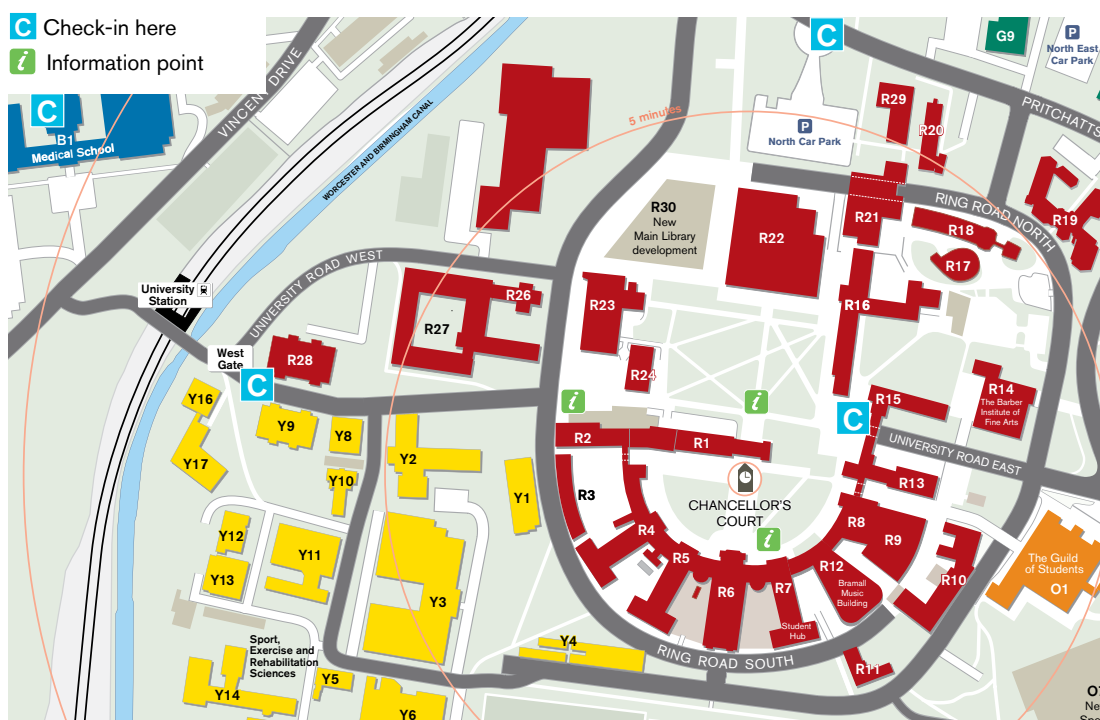
Check-in at open day

CHECK-IN

All visitors are required to check-in on the day. In order to do so, please pre-register online at www.birmingham.ac.uk/opendays. In the days leading up to open day you will receive an email from us with your own personalised event ticket. The ticket will include a QR code which we will use to check you in on the day. Below is a step-by-step guide to your on the day check-in.

- 1** WHEN YOU RECEIVE YOUR EVENT TICKET VIA EMAIL, PLEASE **PRINT IT OFF** IF YOU HAVE ACCESS TO A PRINTER, AS HANDING YOUR TICKET IN MAY HELP YOU BEAT ANY QUEUES. ALTERNATIVELY WE CAN SCAN YOUR TICKET FROM A SMARTPHONE.
- 2** **BRING YOUR EVENT TICKET** TO THE UNIVERSITY OF BIRMINGHAM OPEN DAY.
- 3** WHEN YOU ARRIVE ON CAMPUS, **VISIT ONE OF OUR FOUR CHECK-IN/ INFORMATION POINTS** (SEE CAMPUS MAP FOR LOCATIONS) AND **HAND IN YOUR EVENT TICKET**.*
- 4** AS RECEIPT OF YOUR CHECK-IN ON THE DAY, YOU WILL **RECEIVE** A UNIVERSITY OF BIRMINGHAM BAG TO HELP YOU COLLECT INFORMATION/ LITERATURE THROUGHOUT THE DAY.
- 5** IF YOU NEED TO RUSH OFF TO YOUR FIRST TALK OR ACTIVITY WHEN YOU ARRIVE ON CAMPUS, DON'T WORRY, **YOU CAN CHECK-IN** WHEN YOU HAVE A SPARE FEW MINUTES.
- 6** WE ALSO HAVE **THREE INFORMATION POINTS** THAT YOU CAN VISIT TO PICK UP A **PROGRAMME** AND ASK ANY QUESTIONS THAT YOU MAY HAVE.

VISITORS WITH DISABILITIES

We encourage students with disabilities to visit and study at the University and have implemented a programme of accessibility adaptations on campus. This includes the installation of lifts and accessible toilets and improved signage. All new buildings and major conversions are being designed with accessibility in mind. A mobility map is available from the Aston Webb Reception (R6 on the map), which gives an overview of the Edgbaston campus showing the main access routes for wheelchair users. Blue Badge holders should arrive at the East Gate where security personnel will direct you to the nearest disabled parking spaces.

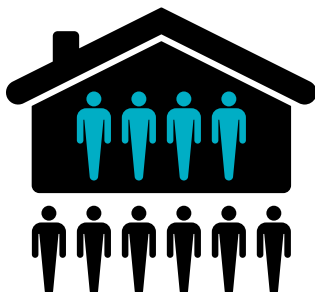

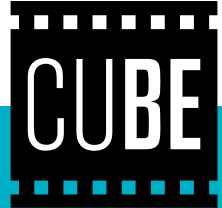

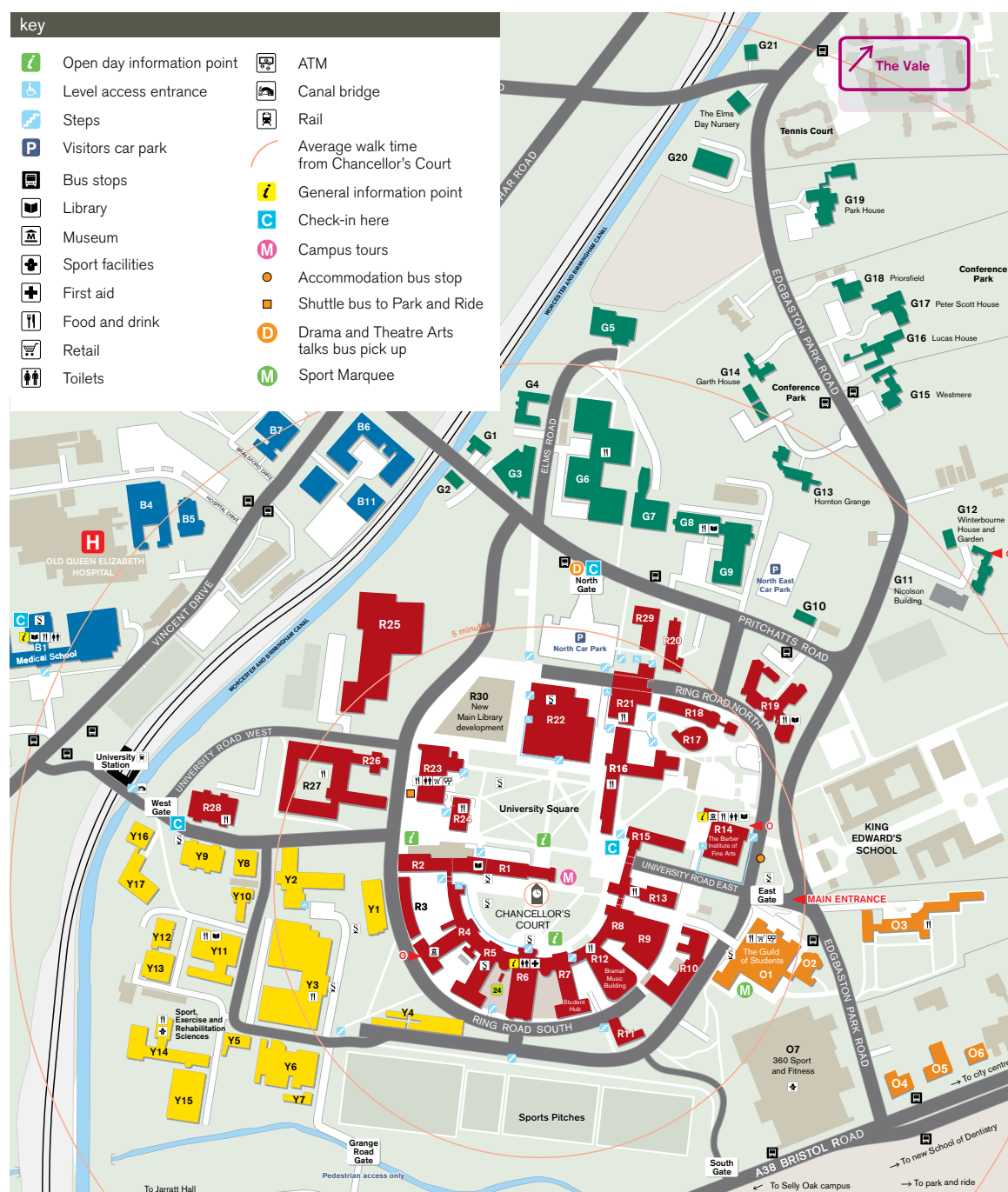
