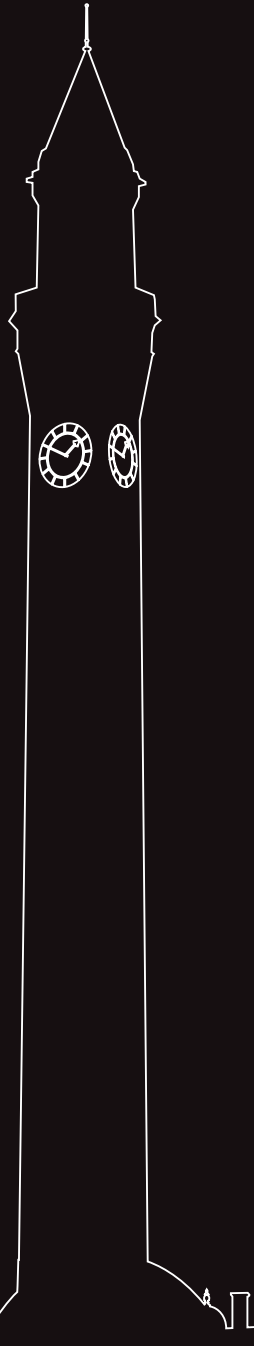

At almost 100m, the University clock tower, known to students as 'Old Joe', is the tallest freestanding clock tower in the world.

At 17 feet 3 inches across, it is possible to drive a double-decker bus through the clockface of 'Old Joe'.

A nest box has been placed at the top of the clock tower where a pair of peregrine falcons nest every year.

How to reach the University



We are pleased that you are planning to attend our open days this year. As part of our commitment to reducing our impact on the environment, we would strongly encourage you to travel by public transport when you visit the University.

Each year we welcome some 15,000 visitors to our open days; as a result, the adjacent roads and University car parks get very busy. The University has only a limited number of car parking spaces on open days and we strongly recommend, where possible, for visitors to use public transport.

By rail

Being the only university in mainland UK with its own station, the easiest way to reach the University is by train. Most cross-country services to Birmingham arrive at New Street station and up to six trains an hour depart for the University on the cross-city line (final destination Longbridge or Redditch). The journey time usually takes less than ten minutes, while the centre of the main campus is a five-minute walk from University station. Student ambassadors (wearing lime green shirts) will be present at New Street station to direct you.

By coach

There are frequent express coach services to Birmingham from London, Heathrow and Gatwick airports and many other UK cities. The long-distance coach station is in Digbeth in the city centre.

By bus

Numbers 61, X62, 63 and 64 travel to the University's Edgbaston and Selly Oak campuses.

Parking on campus

The high number of visitors means that the University is only able to offer a limited number of spaces on these days. If you are intending to travel by car, the University has three main car parks: South, North and Pritchatts Road car parks – guides will be present to direct and assist visitors. Please be aware that these car parks fill up very quickly and that we cannot guarantee a space for all visitors.



Park and ride

In addition to University parking areas, there is a park and ride car park with free shuttle bus services. This is based at King Edwards School playing fields a short distance from the University. Further details and directions can be found at www.birmingham.ac.uk/opendays/travel

Park and ride will be operating on a first-come, first-served basis. Shuttle buses to and from the University will be running throughout the day, dropping off and picking up from outside University Centre (building R23 on the map on the back page).

An inspirational student experience

We have recently announced major new investments in activities to further enhance our student experience, extend programmes that widen participation in higher education as well as providing generous financial support for students from lower income backgrounds.



Investment in the student experience

Over the last three years we have invested in excess of £200 million in our estate, including state-of-the-art learning facilities and in addition we will invest £600 million in a wide range of transformational projects to enhance further the high quality experience that Birmingham students receive. Our brand new Bramall concert hall and music department will open in 2012; we have plans to invest £40 million in new world-class sports (including a 50 metre swimming pool which will be the only one in Birmingham) facilities and the development of a new central library building for our extensive collections.

Student financial support and 2012 tuition fees

From 2012/13 we will introduce enhanced financial support for students from lower income backgrounds and increase outreach activities to promote fair access. Our progressive and targeted financial aid package will offer support to over 4,000 students and will increase our investment in widening access to over £12 million by 2015/6. In the face of government funding cuts, in order to make this investment and continue to provide the highest quality experience and enhance this further, from 2012/13 we will charge full-time UK and EU entrants to our undergraduate courses a fee of £9,000 per annum (which has now been approved subject by the Office for Fair Access (OFFA)).

Investment in our students' careers

We are investing £3.5 million in sector-leading employability services which will provide Birmingham students with the opportunity for mentoring by some of the University's most successful alumni, internships in the UK and overseas and specialist staff offering unique careers guidance tailored to individual academic subject areas: ensuring Birmingham graduates continue to succeed after university. We are also building on our personal academic tutoring system to provide the support and guidance that students need to achieve their full academic potential. 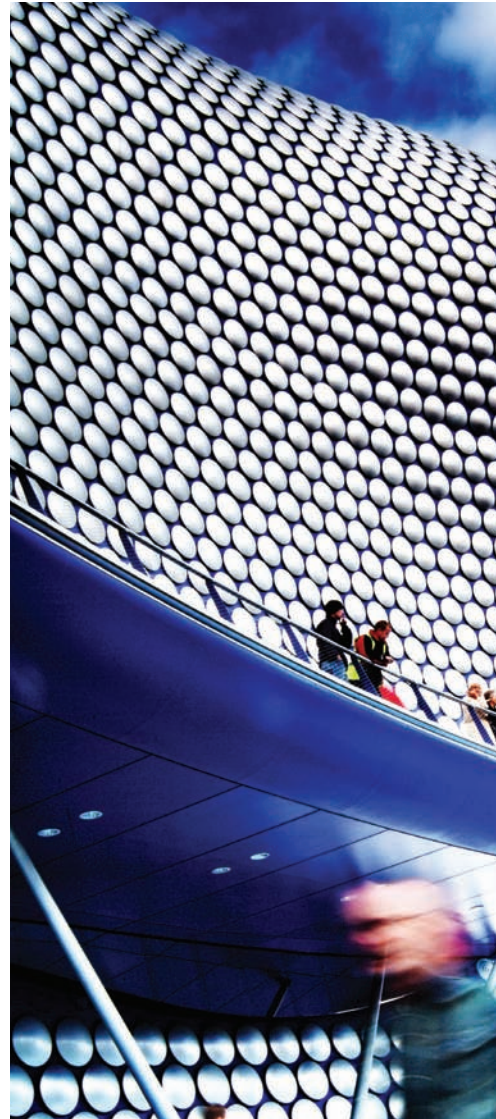
Shopping and style

'Big Brum' Open Top Bus sightseeing tour

If you would like to find out more about the city and discover Birmingham for yourself, why not take part in our live guided open top bus tour? Tickets are free and can be collected from the Aston Webb Reception on a first-come, first-served basis. The tour starts at 4.20pm and lasts for one hour. The bus will pick up visitors from outside the Barber Institute of Fine Arts (building R14 on the map).

- **Food and drink** – Birmingham's multicultural character is reflected in our restaurants: you will find Caribbean, Chinese, Greek, French, Spanish, Thai and other international cuisines
- **Custard Factory** – the former home of Bird's Custard has been transformed into a dynamic and Bohemian community of around 500 artists and small creative enterprises

A sporting city

- **Sporting events** – the city is home to many sporting events, including top level football at Aston Villa and Birmingham City, international cricket at Warwickshire County Cricket ground and prestigious golfing events at the Belfry

Community culture...

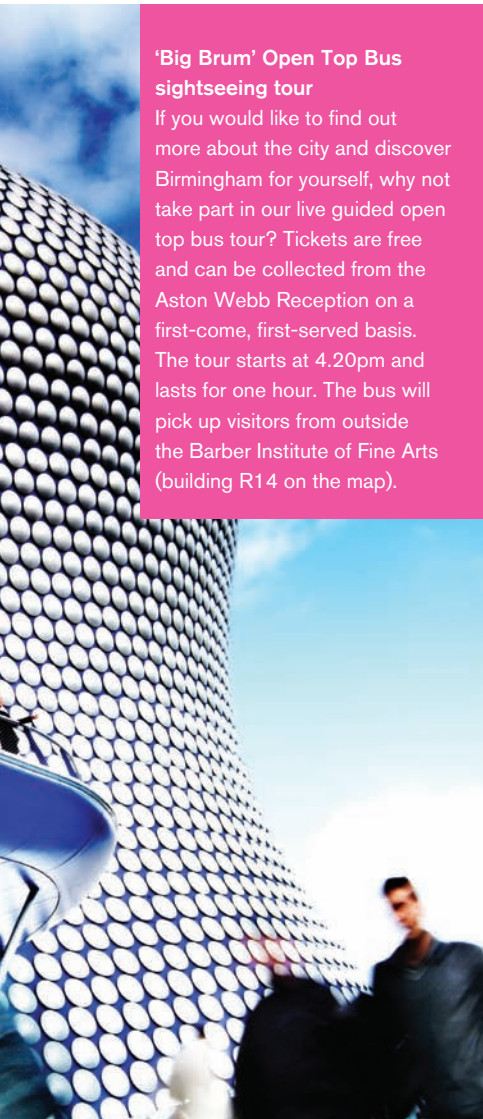
The Midlands Arts Centre (MAC): recently refurbished at a cost of £15 million, this is a community arts centre, theatre and cinema in beautiful Cannon Hill Park.

Bespoke bling...

The Jewellery Quarter: home to Birmingham's historic jewellery trade, the area still boasts more than 400 shops to enjoy – the perfect place to pick up a unique piece at a bargain price.

Hobbit hunting...

Sarehole Mill: this 200-year-old mill is one of only two surviving watermills in Birmingham. The cobbled courtyard and mill pool are a tranquil haven from 21st century life outside. It was a favourite haunt of the young JRR Tolkien. It is said that the Mill and Moseley Bog provided the inspiration for the Shire home to Frodo and Bilbo Baggins.



How to make the most of your day

What's on offer?

In the Great Hall and the Marquee you will find a wide range of subject-specific stands as well as stands relating to sport, welfare, accommodation, finance, careers and other areas. Talks on a range of subjects take place throughout the day. The timetables for talks can be found on page 10 onwards.

Please note that all talks last approximately 30 minutes.

General information

Prior to the open days, you can contact the Student Recruitment Team on 0121 414 3374. On the day, staff at the main reception area in the Aston Webb Building (R6 on the map) will be able to help you with general enquiries, directions and other information. Our student ambassadors will be wearing lime green shirts and will be present across the campus to help you find your way around.

Tours of the Edgbaston campus

Guided walking tours of the main campus take place throughout the day, starting at 9.00am. They last between 45 minutes to an hour. The Campus Tour desk is situated in Chancellor's Court, adjacent to the Marquee.

Heritage tours

While here, why not take a guided tour exploring the historical heritage of the University. The tour, focusing on Chancellor's Court, is an opportunity to find out more about the University's fascinating history, and its importance to the city of Birmingham and the world.

Tours start 11.00am, 1.00pm and 2.00pm and tickets will be available from the Cultural Assets desk in the Marquee, Chancellor's Court.

Viewing accommodation

At regular intervals throughout the day, visitors can view University accommodation. Visitors can either use the walking map to reach accommodation (this takes approximately 15 minutes) or there is a specially provided free bus service. Walking maps may be picked up from all information points and at the base of the clock tower. Buses depart from outside the Barber Institute of Fine Arts (building R14 on the map). In order to avoid congestion you might want to avoid the busiest periods between 12.00noon and 1.30pm. Buses run until 3.15pm and bus tours will take between 45 minutes to an hour.

Visitors with disabilities

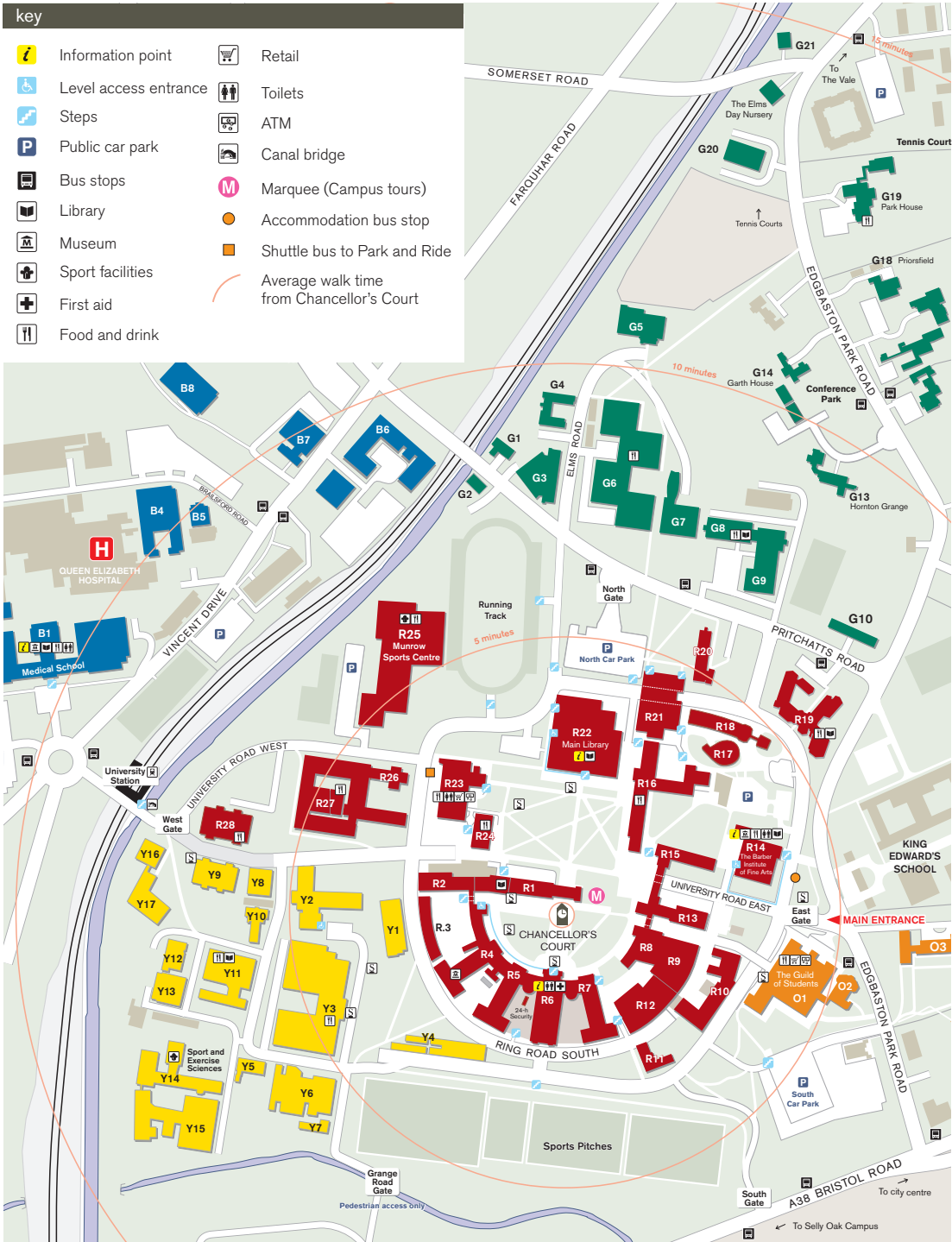
Edgbaston campus map
