

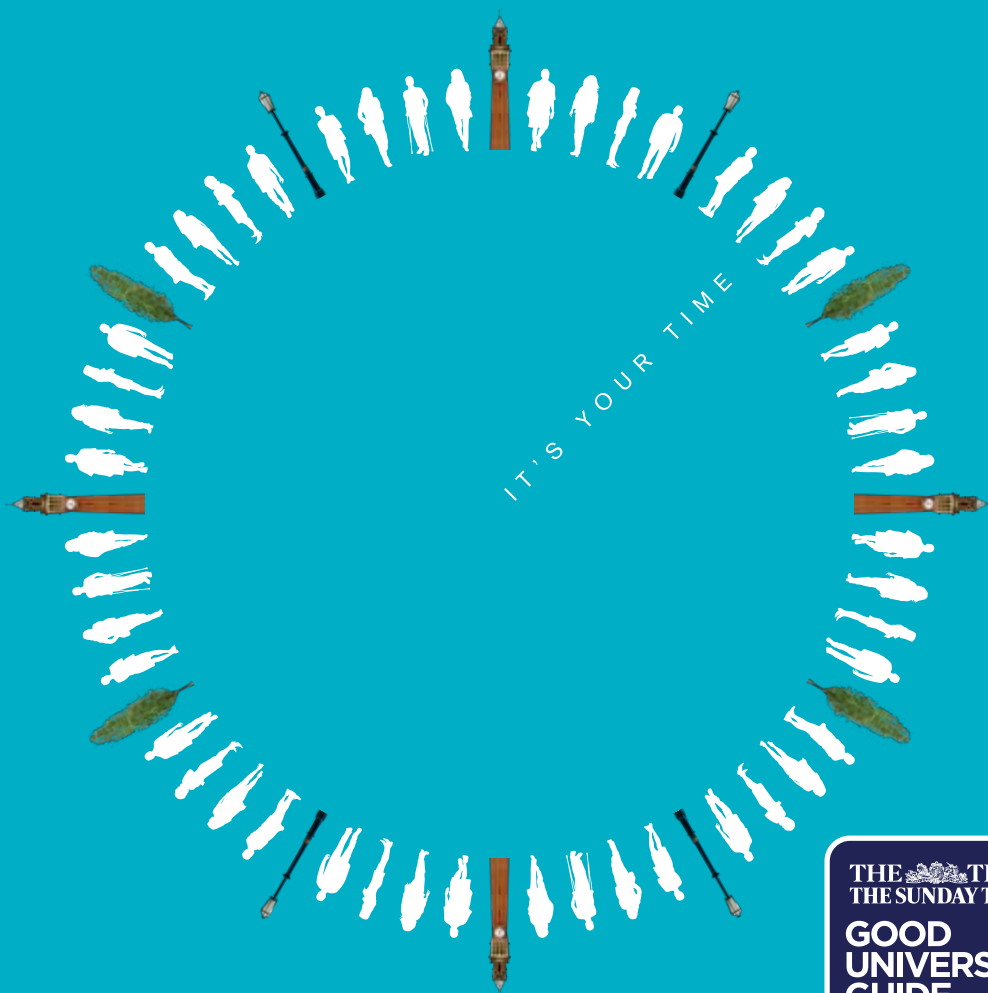

# How to reach the University



We are pleased that you are planning to attend our open days this year. As part of our commitment to reducing our impact on the environment, we would strongly encourage you to travel by public transport when you visit the University.

Each year we welcome some 25,000 visitors to our open days; as a result, the adjacent roads and University car parks fill up very quickly. The University has only a limited number of car parking spaces on open days and we strongly recommend, where possible, for visitors to use public transport.

### By rail

Being the only university in mainland UK with its own station, the easiest way to reach the University is by train. Most cross-country services to Birmingham arrive at Birmingham New Street station and up to six trains an hour depart for University on the cross-city line (final destination Longbridge or Redditch). The journey time usually takes less than ten minutes, while the centre of the main campus is a five-minute walk from University station. Student ambassadors (wearing lime green shirts) will be present at Birmingham New Street station to direct you. Your final destination for purchasing train tickets will be 'University (Birmingham)'.



### By coach

There are frequent express coach services to Birmingham from London, Heathrow and Gatwick airports and many other UK cities. The long-distance coach station is in Digbeth in the city centre.

### By bus

Numbers 61, 63 and X64 travel to the University's Edgbaston and Selly Oak campuses.

### Parking on campus

Parking on open days is extremely limited and the majority of visitors will be unable to find a space on campus. We therefore recommend that visitors use public transport to reach the University or find alternative parking in and around the city. The University has three main car parks: North East (B15 2SA), North (B15 2SB) and Pritchatts Car Park (B15 2QU) (free of charge); parking will

also be available at the West Car Park (near the Medical School) on Vincent Drive (free of charge) however please note that these are used by staff and students and fill up very quickly and therefore we cannot guarantee a space for visitors.

### Park and ride

In addition to University parking there is an overspill park and ride car park with some limited parking. This is based at King Edward's School playing field (B29 7JX – the playing fields is a left turn if approaching from the city centre, just before the Eastern Road turn) on the Bristol Road. Park and ride will be operating on a first-come, first-served basis. Shuttle buses to and from the University will be running throughout the day, dropping off and picking up from outside University Centre (building R23 on the map on the inside back page).

The first park and ride will leave King Edward's School playing field at 8.30am. The last bus will leave University Centre at 4.30pm. There is no charge for the park and ride car park.

# Check-in at open day

## CHECK-IN

In the days leading up to open day you will receive an email from us with your own personalised event ticket. The ticket will include a QR code which we will use to check you in on the day. Below is a step by step guide to your on the day check-in.

- 2** **BRING YOUR EVENT TICKET** TO THE UNIVERSITY OF BIRMINGHAM OPEN DAY.
- 3** WHEN YOU ARRIVE ON CAMPUS, **VISIT ONE OF OUR FOUR CHECK-IN/ INFORMATION POINTS** (SEE CAMPUS MAP FOR LOCATIONS) AND **HAND IN YOUR EVENT TICKET**.\*

\*This will allow you to 'check-in' to the open day.

- 4** AS RECEIPT OF YOUR CHECK-IN ON THE DAY, YOU WILL **RECEIVE** A UNIVERSITY OF BIRMINGHAM BAG TO HELP YOU COLLECT INFORMATION/ LITERATURE THROUGHOUT THE DAY.

- 5** IF YOU NEED TO RUSH OFF TO YOUR FIRST TALK OR ACTIVITY WHEN YOU ARRIVE ON CAMPUS, DON'T WORRY, **YOU CAN CHECK-IN** WHEN YOU HAVE A SPARE FEW MINUTES.

- 6** WE ALSO HAVE **THREE INFORMATION POINTS** THAT YOU CAN VISIT TO PICK UP A **PROGRAMME** AND ASK ANY QUESTIONS THAT YOU MAY HAVE.

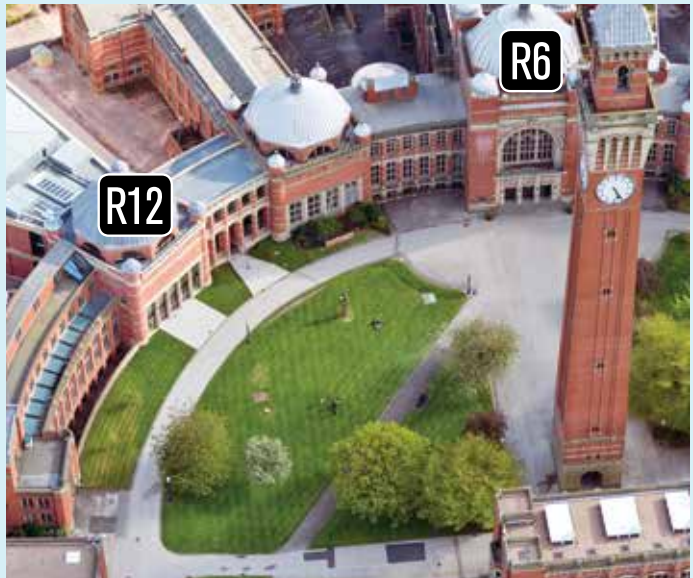

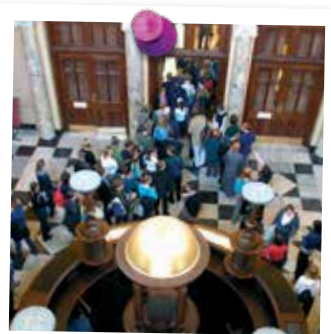

# Tours and activities

## Campus tours

Guided walking tours of the main campus take place throughout the day, starting at 9.00am. They last between 45 minutes to an hour. The Campus Tour tent is situated in Chancellor's Court.

## Accommodation viewing

Throughout the day, visitors can view samples of University accommodation at one of our three Accommodation sites (The Vale student village). Visitors can either use the walking map to reach accommodation (this takes approximately 15 minutes) or there is a specially provided free bus service. Walking maps may be picked up from all information booths and at the base of the clock tower. The route is also available to view on the open day mobile application, available at [www.birmingham.ac.uk/contact/app-store.aspx](http://www.birmingham.ac.uk/contact/app-store.aspx).

Buses depart from outside the Barber Institute of Fine Arts (building R14 on the map) and drop visitors at Maple Bank the first residence open to view at the Vale Village. To get the bus back to campus there is a bus stop outside Mason accommodation. We expect the buses to Accommodation to be popular with queues likely, especially between 11.00am and 2.30pm. Buses will run from 9.00am until 3.15pm and you will need to allow between 45 minutes to an hour to travel to and view the Accommodation.

To view all available accommodation join us for our annual Accommodation Open Day, to be held on Saturday 19 March. This day offers you the opportunity to view all residences and speak to students about their experiences. Highly recommended if you have 30 minutes or more available.

Alternatively, you can join our free guided tour of the galleries, the permanent collection and the latest exhibitions and displays – including 'The Modernist Face: Smith, Dobson and British Portraiture' (Curated by the University's postgraduate History of Art Students with sculpture and paintings from the National Portrait Gallery, London; to 27 September) and 'Inheriting Rome: The Imperial Legacy in Coinage and Culture' (to 24 January 2016). These tours will be given by the gallery's collections and learning team. Meet in the foyer at the Barber Institute (building R14 on the map), underneath the portrait of Lady Barber.

### Investment in our students' careers

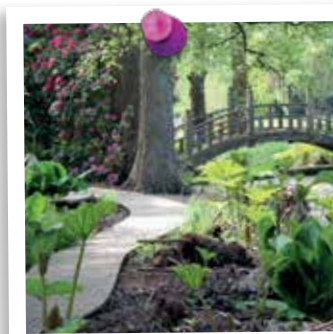

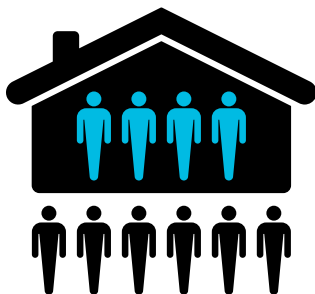

# The city of Birmingham

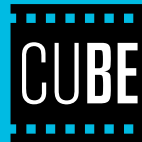
Birmingham has been transformed into a city for young professionals and is one of Europe's most exciting destinations. It is more than somewhere to study; it is somewhere to build a successful career.
