The University is just a short taxi, bus or train journey from the City Centre. The city is at the centre of England and at the hub of its transport network, only one and a half hours away from London by train. Birmingham Airport is just 25 minutes by taxi from the University's Edgbaston campus and offers direct flights to the USA, North Africa, Dubai, and European destinations with connections worldwide via Amsterdam, Frankfurt and Istanbul.
