The awards are available to students in any subject area available at the University of Birmingham.

Eligibility criteria

- Candidates will be citizens and permanent residents of Brazil at the time of application
- · Candidates must not be currently working or studying abroad
- Candidates must hold an offer from the University of Birmingham to be eligible for a scholarship; they must therefore fulfil the relevant academic and English language proficiency entry requirements

Application process

Candidates need to make two separate and simultaneous applications:

- 2. To CAPES (http://www.capes.gov.br/editais/abertos/6748-programa-capesuniversidade-de-nottingham-universidade-de-birmingham-bolsa-de-doutorado-pleno)

Applicants should apply to the University of Birmingham by the 2nd April 2014 and submit a separate application to CAPES between the 17th February 2014 and 2nd April 2014.

The deadline for applications to CAPES is 17:59 (Brazilian Time) on the 2nd April 2014

Candidates will only be considered for the award where they have been selected by CAPES and are in receipt of an offer from the University of Birmingham.
