Art and music have always dwelt in harmony at the Barber Institute, bringing extra appeal to this exhibition of works lent by the **National Portrait Gallery** (<http://www.npg.org.uk/beyond/exhibitions/partnership2/facing-the-music.php>) – the first in a prestigious series of partnership shows at the Barber.

Indeed, Edward Elgar was the University of Birmingham's first Professor of Music, a position later filled by Granville Bantock. Delius, Vaughan Williams, Britten, Birtwistle and Adès are some of the other leading lights of 20th-century British musical composition celebrated in this show by a group of artists no less significant. The exhibition features paintings and photographs by John Singer Sargent, Christopher Wood, Cecil Beaton, David Hockney and Tom Phillips, among others.

The images of the composers will be supplemented by remarkable original or annotated scores, and diaries, letters and other personal items relating to them, drawn from the University's own Special Collections. This exhibition is co-curated with postgraduate History of Art students from the University of Birmingham. The postgraduates have also embraced social media to give a behind-the-scenes look at putting this exhibition together.
