

## Continuing students

### Enrolment

If you wish to continue your MOMD language study in subsequent academic years, you should enrol with Languages for All in the summer term of the current year to reserve your place. You will be given your module code on enrolment.

Subject to availability of places, we can accept additional enrolments during week 1 of the autumn term.

### Timetable

Courses are timetabled in slots reserved for MOMD courses on the University block timetable, as well as at alternative times in daytime or evening timeslots. (At this stage, our timetable is provisional and we reserve the right to make changes, depending upon the level of enrolments and take-up of places in teaching groups.)

### Course Structure

All language MOMDs comprise 2 hours of teaching per week, at which attendance is compulsory. Canvas is used to supplement the contact hours with your tutor. For project-based courses, contact hours are reduced, but your course tutor is available at set times for advice and guidance.

### Assessment

All language MOMDs are assessed by a written unseen examination in the University's main examination period and an oral examination, which takes place in the first two weeks after the university Easter vacation.

### Tandem Modules

Tandem Learning involves structured learning in partnership with a native speaker of your target language, supervised by our teaching staff.
