Course Background

There has been much debate on the risks of cervical manipulation, and the examination of the cervical region for potential of cervical artery dysfunction in recent years between manual therapists worldwide. In response to this, the MACP commissioned work by an internationally respected group to systematically evaluate the evidence and develop a resource for clinicians to assist their understanding of cervical blood flow. Roger Kerry has been part of this group from its inception, publishing and lecturing nationally and internationally in this field.

Learning Objectives

The aim of the workshop is to provide an update on current thinking in cervical artery dysfunction by Roger Kerry. The workshop will also outline the development of an international framework for examining the cervical region, led by Dr Alison Rushton, Chair of Standards Committee for International Federation of Orthopaedic Manipulative Physical Therapists (IFOMPT), soon to be available through IFOMPT.
