How to take part

Furthermore, I understand that, in the rare event of a student being assessed "at risk" either to themselves or to others and if they are unwilling or unable to take appropriate action themselves, the Head of ISAS will be informed and will assume responsibility for acting to ensure the health and safety of an individual or others e.g. by seeking medical assistance.

I understand that Case Records may be made available for inspection by the Immigration Services Commissioner, upon request, subject to Data Protection Regulations.
