Our collections

Main Library

Our **Main Library** (<https://intranet.birmingham.ac.uk/as/libraryservices/library/about/libraries/mainlibrary/index.aspx>) holds all of our major collections for:

- **Geography**
Our collection holds material which covers all aspects of human and physical geography. Collection strengths include hydrology and meteorology. Interdisciplinary research areas include economy, society and development.
- **Earth Sciences**
Earth Sciences material covers key texts required for courses in geology, environmental geoscience, palaeobiology and palaeoenvironments.
- **Environmental Sciences**
Environmental Sciences material is held in the Main Library. Some key texts relating to ecology and conservation are also held in the Barnes Library. Material for postgraduate courses run by Environmental Health and Risk Management is largely held in the Main Library. This material includes key texts on air pollution and its management. Some public and occupational health material is held in the **Barnes Library** (<https://intranet.birmingham.ac.uk/as/libraryservices/library/about/libraries/barnes.aspx>). Interdisciplinary research areas include nanotechnology.
