Chris Allen (CoSS) was interviewed across a range of BBC radio stations about Islamophobia and the rise of the far-right, in the light of the tragic events in Norway.

These included: BBC Radio 4, BBC Cornwall, Stoke, Coventry and Warwickshire, Manchester, Sheffield, West Midlands and Guernsey.
