

## Jamaican Track and Field Team thank University after golden success

The world's fastest man chose the University of Birmingham to prepare for his next great challenge as Team Jamaica used our Edgbaston campus as their pre-Olympics training camp.

For 12 days the Jamaican Track and Field trained on campus before competing in the London 2012 Olympics Games. The team achieved incredible success at the Games, finishing third in the track and field medal table with four gold, four silver and four bronze medals. Usain Bolt and the rest of the Jamaican 4x100 metre relay team took time out after winning Olympic gold to personally thank the University.
