With the opening of the **Bramall music building** (<http://www.birmingham.ac.uk/bramall/index.aspx>) in September 2012, the University has embarked on an exciting musical journey. The 450-seat auditorium is the most flexible performance space at a UK university - suitable for performances from solo voice, early music, to a full symphony orchestra. When not used for music, it is a high profile location for drama and dance performance and for prestigious lectures.

The 16 million pound investment will continue to attract and train the most talented students- nurturing them as they go on to make an important contribution to composition and performance of music in the UK and worldwide.

The University offers a number of **scholarships in Music** (</undergraduate/fees/funding/music-scholarships.aspx>), each worth £1,000 per year to students who plan to start their studies at Birmingham in 2014-15. The scholarships are available to any academic subject (however you must not be studying a programme offered by the Department of Music).

The awards are open to home undergraduate students only and will be tenable for three years, subject to satisfactory academic progression at 2:1 standard.
