

## MRes Ottoman Studies



This programme is designed to introduce you to the state of the field in current research on Ottoman history, cultural studies and allied disciplines. It comprises a major individual research project, supervised by a specialist in the field of study, and taught elements which provide appropriate training in the use of original sources, both narrative and documentary, in Ottoman Turkish.

### Details

The programme is made up of 60 credits of taught modules (see the modules section below) and 120 credits achieved through a 20,000 word supervised research project on topic of your choice in Ottoman Studies.

In addition to developing professional skills in identifying and analysing key methodological and interpretative trends in Ottoman Studies, you gain experience in carrying out original research using primary sources.

The course may be taken as a self-standing degree or as the first stage of research training towards the three year PhD programme in Ottoman Studies.

### Modules

- Methodologies of Ottoman Studies (20/40 credits)
- Ottoman Language and selected historical texts (20 / 40 credits)
- Ottoman Historical Sources (20 / 40 credits)
- Aspects of Ottoman History 1300-1800 (20 / 40 credits)
- Aspects of Great Power Rivalry in the East Mediterranean 1850-2000 (40 credits)

### Fees and funding

We charge an annual tuition fee. Fees for 2015/16 are currently as follows:

- Home / EU £4,052 full-time; £2,026 part-time
- Overseas: £13,195 full-time; £6,597.50 part-time

For part-time students, the above fee quoted is for year one only and tuition fees will also be payable in subsequent years of your programme.

Tuition fees can either be paid in full or by instalments.
