

MRes Directing

New for 2014, this course aims to prepare you practically and intellectually for a career in theatre directing. The course is delivered in partnership with several local and regional theatre companies (see Professional Preparation module), providing assistant directing placement opportunities alongside practical and academic study of theatre directing.

Modules include Dramatic Structure, Directors Workshop, and Professional Preparation. Dramatic Structure is undertaken alongside students on our long-standing **MRes Playwriting course** ([/postgraduate/courses/combined/drama/playwriting-studies.aspx](http://postgraduate/courses/combined/drama/playwriting-studies.aspx)), enhancing collaboration with writers.

This course allows you to research and direct your own work as part of a final practical project and written thesis, supported by staff and professional-level facilities.

Details

This course allows you to research and direct your own work as part of a final practical project and written thesis, supported by staff and professional-level facilities. The course is delivered in partnership with several local and regional theatre companies, providing placement opportunities alongside practical and academic study of theatre directing.

Over the course of the year you will work towards a Dissertation Portfolio, which will comprise a short, focused creative practice project and an extended piece of writing.

Please note that for the 2014 entry MRes Directing will not be offered on a part time basis.

Modules

Directors Workshop

Through tutor-led and small group exercises you will explore advanced analysis of text in relation to the practical demands of directing, explore skills in staging, experience working with elements of technical choices and consider different approaches to working with actors and the collaborative process of producing performance.

Dramatic Structure

This module addresses key dramaturgical terms, introduces you to a range of dramatic approaches and centres on three case studies. It is taught in collaboration with MRes Playwriting.

Professional Preparation

This module takes the form of an assistantship placement with a local or regional company. Our partners include the BE Festival, Birmingham REP, **Stan's Cafe** ([/postgraduate/courses/combined/drama/directing-partners/stans-cafe.aspx](http://postgraduate/courses/combined/drama/directing-partners/stans-cafe.aspx)), Theatre Absolute, the New Vic, and Talking Birds. Students are also able to negotiate their own placements, either in the UK or abroad, and a small bursary is available to support this.

Dissertation portfolio

The Dissertation Portfolio represents the culmination of the year's work in practical and theoretical approaches to the creation and/or facilitation of live performance. The Portfolio will comprise a short, focused creative practice project and an extended piece of writing. Each piece of work is weighted equally in the final assessment of this module, and they will be developed, undertaken, and examined together.

Fees and funding

We charge an annual tuition fee.* Fees for 2015/16 are as follows:

- Home / EU: £5,152
- Overseas: £14,295

*NB: Due to the nature of this course, it is subject to a £1,100 bench fee which is included in the fee quoted above.

Additional information:

As well as demonstrable previous theatre directing experience, the typical entry requirement is a good 2:1 undergraduate degree or above. International applicants should also take note of the English language requirements. Successful applicants will also be called for interview.

References and a personal statement will be required as part of the online application form, along with a research proposal. Although to some extent provisional, the research proposal should demonstrate what practical project you would wish to undertake at the end of the degree programme, its aims and how it will be written about in the accompanying thesis. The Graduate School's pages give further information as to how to structure the research proposal.

Birmingham's Drama and Theatre Arts postgraduates develop a very wide range of skills and qualities during their degree. Performance develops communication, team working and confidence, whilst all of our postgraduates also develop time management, critical and analytical skills, the ability to formulate and solve problems, develop opinions and new ideas, and an aptitude for thinking and working creatively with others.

Over the past five years, over 94% of Drama and Theatre Arts postgraduates were in work and/or further study six months after graduation. Some of our graduates enter roles for which their programme has especially prepared them, such as playwriting, screenwriting or teaching drama; others use their transferable skills in a wide variety of occupations ranging from media sales and management to events and arts administration; and some choose to pursue careers in academia. Employers that our graduates have gone on to work for include: Arts Council England; Imperial College London; Musicleader West Midlands; National Theatre; North Warwickshire Council; University of Gloucestershire.

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
