

Primary Care Considerations in Oral Surgery and Oral Medicine

This module reinforces core knowledge in the area of oral surgery and medicine through studies of the principles of human disease in relation to general dental practice and local manifestations of systemic disease; including drug-related conditions. Following an update on oral mucosal disease diagnostic approaches are introduced to underpin the clinical aspects of oral cancer; including early detection. Other areas of clinical skill development will include guidelines for removal of third molar teeth; the "difficult" extraction; the nature of facial pain; TMJ dysfunction; treating a medical emergencies and resuscitation.
