

Specialist Neurological Rehabilitation 2: Evaluation of Rehabilitation Practice

This module facilitates analysis of your prior experience in neurological rehabilitation to enable the exploration of this specialist area in the context of evidence based practice. It builds upon your existing knowledge and experience of the assessment and management of neurological dysfunction to enable understanding and effective management of the complexity of clinical presentations. This is achieved through the establishment of a framework of continuing Professional Development and a focus on the development of clinical reasoning and clinical expertise.

- Evaluate and progress the management intervention in neurological rehabilitation
