Value of Award

Grants of £500 per year are available for Jewish students studying at UK universities.

Eligibility Criteria

The Anglo-Jewish Association provides financial assistance to Jewish students in financial need studying for full-time degrees at universities in the United Kingdom.

Through its management of a number of educational Trusts, the AJA offers bursaries and scholarships to students wishing to study in a number of specific fields, such as medicine and science, as well as more general areas of study.
