

Research in CREMS



CREMS staff have undertaken, are engaged with, or are currently planning groundbreaking projects on a range of early modern topics of international significance. A small selection of these are explored below.

From 2003 to 2006, [Richard Cust](/staff/profiles/history/cust-richard.aspx) and Andrew Hooper received AHRC funding for a major project to research and edit the records of Court of Chivalry for the period 1634-1640. The project resulted in an online searchable database of records from the court's heyday, [The Court of Chivalry](http://www.court-of-chivalry.bham.ac.uk/), as well as the companion volume R.P.Cust and A.J.Hopper (eds), *Cases in the High Court of Chivalry, 1634-1640* (Harleian Society, new series vol. 18, 2006).

[Tara Hamling](/staff/profiles/history/hamling-tara.aspx) is currently working on a book, co-authored with Catherine Richardson, on the materiality of daily life in the English domestic interior, 1500-1700. Research towards this project is funded by a [Philip Leverhulme Prize](http://www.leverhulme.ac.uk/news/awards/plp.cfm) (2010). She is the Co-Investigator for an AHRC-funded research network, [Ways of Seeing the English Domestic Interior, 1500-1700](http://www.kent.ac.uk/mems/domestic%20interior.html) (2012-2013) and is supervising an AHRC Collaborative Doctorate in partnership with the Shakespeare Birthplace Trust on the [Material Culture and Cultural Heritage of Shakespeare's England](/schools/edacs/departments/shakespeare/research/projects/material-culture.aspx) (2010-2013).
