'Consent' is one of the most heavily debated concepts in feminist activism and academia, in law and social policy-making, and in sexual sub-cultural politics. The remit of the concept of 'consent' is very broad, including questions of medical ethics and varied legal applications of 'informed consent'. This workshop, however, will deal with the usefulness and limitations of the concept of specifically sexual consent, interrogated from a range of academic disciplinary perspectives and by participants with varying degrees of commitment to, or skepticism of, the ethos of consent.



The workshop draws on the expertise of a range of Birmingham scholars, from postgraduate researchers to senior professors, as well as inviting selected world-leading international scholars working on the problem. In addition, professionals from the legal and psychiatric fields, and activists and writers who have made public interventions into the debates around 'rape culture' and 'consent culture', will be invited to contribute. It is expected that the workshop will lay the groundwork for a raft of external funding bids and will establish the cross-University Sexuality and Gender Studies Network at Birmingham as a leading national and international centre for research and agenda-setting on the question of sexual consent.
