Biography

Chris Honan studied Ornithology at the University of Birmingham when he investigated mercury accumulation in the feathers of an apex avian predator as a bio-indicator of mercury in marine systems. He now continues the work on the same species but now turning his attention to its fundamental importance in the ecology of a marine community on an island close to the city of Dublin.

Seabird ecology and especially the responses of seabird communities to environmental change.
