

Chevening Fellowship Programme in the Economics of Energy

In 2005 the Foreign and Commonwealth Office launched a new Fellowship scheme with the aim of bringing to the UK mid-career and senior professionals from a range of disciplines in predominantly Muslim countries for specially tailored three month courses.

The programme is for 14 mid-career professionals from overseas (nominated by their local British Embassy or High Commission) and consists of twelve weeks of lectures, visits and placements. The objective of the programme is to promote an understanding of the economic dynamics of energy markets, and their technical, environmental and policy drivers.
