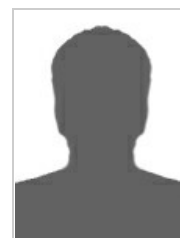

Roger Backhouse's recent research has been on the history of economics, including a book on John Maynard Keynes, and the the history of the social sciences since 1945. His book, co-authored with Mauro Boianovsky, *Transforming Modern Macroeconomics; Exploring Disequilibrium Microfoundations, 1956-2003* has been awarded the Blangui Prize by the European Society of the History of Economic Thought. His main current project is an intellectual biography of Paul A. Samuelson, supported by a Leverhulme Trust Major Research Fellowship.
