### About

Dr Andy Hodder joined Birmingham Business School in September 2012 after completing a PhD at Keele University. Andy's PhD looked at trade union organising within the Public and Commercial Services union (PCS). This research reviewed the extent to which the PCS has adopted the organising agenda and evaluated its impact on membership and levels of activism, during a period of civil service modernisation.

Andy has also conducted research into the relationship between young workers and trade unions in the UK and is currently working with Professor John Kelly (Birkbeck), Dr Nick McCarthy (PCS) and Dr Mark Williams (Surrey) on issues associated with union mobilisation and strike action. With Dr Geraint Harvey (University of Birmingham), Andy is also looking at trade union involvement in Corporate Social Responsibility.
