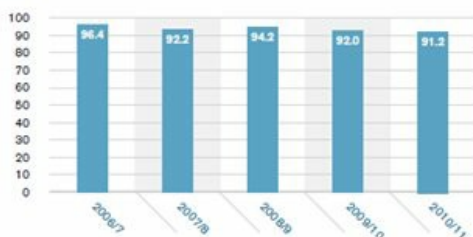

Employability statistics

Over the last five years, 93.2% of taught postgraduates and 94.1% of research postgraduates from the College of Arts and Law have been in work and/or further study just six months after graduating. The two charts below show the breakdown of these statistics for each year, for taught postgraduate and research postgraduate respondents.
