The **Midlands3Cities Doctoral Training Partnership** (<http://www.midlands3cities.ac.uk/midlands-3-cities/index.aspx>), is awarding 87 PhD studentships across six institutions in 2015/16. Applications have now closed, but will reopen for the 2016/17 round in September 2015.

Here at Birmingham, we are very proud of the breadth and depth of the research undertaken in the College of Arts and Law and across the University, offering a wide range of specialisms, alongside access to the expertise across the six HEIs which make up Midlands3Cities.

Through the partnership, the University of Birmingham's AHRC-funded PhD students will have the opportunity to draw on the combined expertise of the Universities of Birmingham, Nottingham and Leicester, Birmingham City University, Nottingham Trent University and De Montfort University.

This doctoral scheme provides studentships which enable you to undertake and complete a doctoral degree. Studentships will normally be for up to three years for full-time study, or up to six years for part-time study.

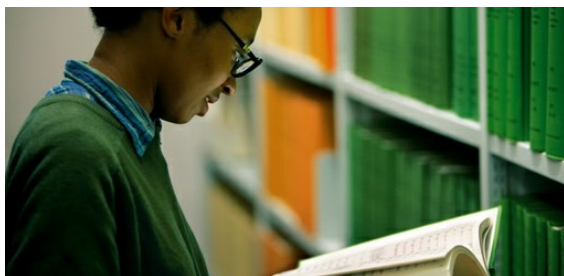
Visual Arts and History of Art

Studentship application eligibility

AHRC funding is open to all UK and EU students*, who meet the academic and residency eligibility criteria as detailed in the AHRC studentship guidelines(PDF), Section 7 (page 60) and Annex A (Page 92).

International applicants: alternative funding opportunities

AHRC funding in the Midlands3Cities Doctoral Training Partnerships currently only open to UK and EU students. For more information on opportunities for International Students, please our International fees and fundingpages.

Studentship types and values

Full-time studentships

A full-time studentship award consists of three parts:

- Payment of approved fees (as set and agreed by the Research Councils) - currently £3,900 p.a.
- Maintenance grant (or stipend) for the student - currently £13,726 p.a.*
- Research Training Support Grant (RTSG) which includes UK/Overseas fieldwork and attendance at conferences (by application only for current PhD students)

* EU Students, unless they have been living in the UK for 3 years previous to the start of their studentship, are normally awarded a Fees Only studentship. This is in line with Research Council rules. In the Midlands3Cities Doctoral Training Partnership, we are currently exploring ways in which a stipend could also be provided from Institutional funds in order to enable us to offer a fully-funded studentship to EU applicants. This is not guaranteed as it is dependent on funds available, but we hope to be able to offer stipends wherever possible. Therefore, EU applicants should submit an application and, if successful, will be informed of the level of funding they have been awarded. On that basis, they will be able to decide whether to accept the offer or to decline the studentship.

Part-time studentships

A part-time studentship consists of:

- Payment of approved pro-rata part-time fees
- A pro-rata maintenance grant, at 50% of the stipend (see 'Full-time studentships')
- Research Training Support Grant (RTSG) which includes UK/Overseas fieldwork and attendance at conferences (by application only for current PhD students)

Fees only studentship

A fees only studentship consists of:

- Payment of approved fees (as set and agreed by the Research Councils)

- Research Training Support Grant (RTSG) which includes UK/Overseas fieldwork and attendance at conferences (by application only for current PhD students)

* Unless they have been living in the UK for 3 years previous to the start of their studentship, are normally awarded a Fees Only studentship. This is in line with Research Council rules. In the Midlands3Cities Doctoral Training Partnership, we are currently exploring ways in which a stipend could also be provided from Institutional funds in order to enable us to offer a fully-funded studentship to EU applicants. This is not guaranteed as it is dependent on funds available, but we hope to be able to offer stipends wherever possible. Therefore, EU applicants should submit an application and, if successful, will be informed of the level of funding they have been awarded. On that basis, they will be able to decide whether to accept the offer or to decline the studentship.
