Our School is an international community, with staff and students from many different countries.

Undergraduate students from other European countries take modules in the School as part of their **Erasmus** (<http://www.birmingham.ac.uk/international/collaborate/erasmus.aspx>) exchange programme. Some students from this School, especially those taking **American and Canadian Studies** ([research/activity/acs/index.aspx](http://www.birmingham.ac.uk/research/activity/acs/index.aspx)), spend a year abroad, and we welcome students from our partner institutions in exchange.

Our postgraduate community is particularly diverse, with students from over a dozen different countries studying at the **Shakespeare Institute** ([schools/edacs/departments/shakespeare/index.aspx](http://www.birmingham.ac.uk/schools/edacs/departments/shakespeare/index.aspx)), in English Language, on Masters programmes such as **MA Film and Television**

Doctoral researchers too come from all over the world, studying subjects as diverse as US foreign policy, Corpus Linguistics, Early-Modern Literature, and Creative Writing.

As a School we particularly welcome visiting scholars to the **Centre for Advanced Research in English** ([/facilities/care/index.aspx](http://www.birmingham.ac.uk/facilities/care/index.aspx)), where up to 40 visitors a year stay for anything from a few weeks to several months. We have strong research links with colleagues in Canada, Italy, Australia, the US and China.
