Qualified Teacher of the Visually Impaired at Birmingham Sensory Support Service

### Career experiences

In 1997 I began working at Exhall Grange Special School for visually impaired and physically disabled pupils (in Coventry), on a maternity placement. I completed my NQT Year and applied for the permanent post. I worked there for 5 ½ years. Whilst working there fulltime I undertook and completed the 2 Year mandatory qualification (BPhil). I moved to working for the Specialist Support Service in January 2005 and have remained there since, working as a Teacher of the Visually Impaired. I am a peripatetic teacher, working with a wide variety of children, schools and families, along with professionals.

### What is the best thing about what you are doing now?

Variety!

### And the worse thing?

The diversity can be a challenge.

### What was the best thing about your time as a student here?

Opportunity to meet a variety of people, new friendships, people with like-minded attitudes.

### And the worse thing?

During the BPhil, the fact I was working full-time and completing a degree.
