Nicola Gauld is a freelance curator, experienced outreach worker and early career researcher. She studied History of Art at the University of Aberdeen and attained a PhD in 2006. Since then she has worked on a number of exhibitions and outreach projects, including Endless Forms: Charles Darwin, Natural Science and the Visual Arts (Fitzwilliam Museum, 2009), Children's Lives (BMAG, 2011), Caught in the Crossfire: Artistic responses to conflict, peace and reconciliation (Herbert Art Gallery & Museum, 2013), and, most recently, Fight for the Right: the Birmingham Suffragettes, a history project supported by the HLF and the Library of Birmingham in which students from two local schools explored the suffrage campaign in Birmingham and produced a historical re-enactment film.
