

## About us

The School of Electronic, Electrical and Computer Engineering was awarded 24 points out of 24 in the last Teaching Quality Assessment. Our research grant and contract funding exceeds £2 million per annum and in the 2008 RAE 85% of our research was judged to be of international standing, with 60% internationally leading.



### Funding

The turnover on research is £2 million per year, and in the last government Research Assessment Exercise (RAE) the School received a grade 5. This indicates that a large part of the research in the School is at world leading level, and this continues to be a major factor in the School's success. The £2 million comes from a variety of sources including UK government and industry as well as the European Union. We are always very successful in getting European funding for many of our research projects.

### Teaching

In the latest government survey, we attained a score of 24/24 for our teaching, and full marks were also awarded in a more recent survey of the University. Our

aim is to maintain and improve on this high quality in all aspects of our work. The School has 28 academic staff and 15 support staff who look after over 500 undergraduate students, around 60 MSc Students and a similar number of students studying for their doctorate.

### Activities

The School has a large number of activities, ranging from the teaching of undergraduate degrees, to using our expertise to help local companies. Whichever aspect of Electronic, Electrical or Computer Engineering is of interest, we usually have some form of activity in the School.
