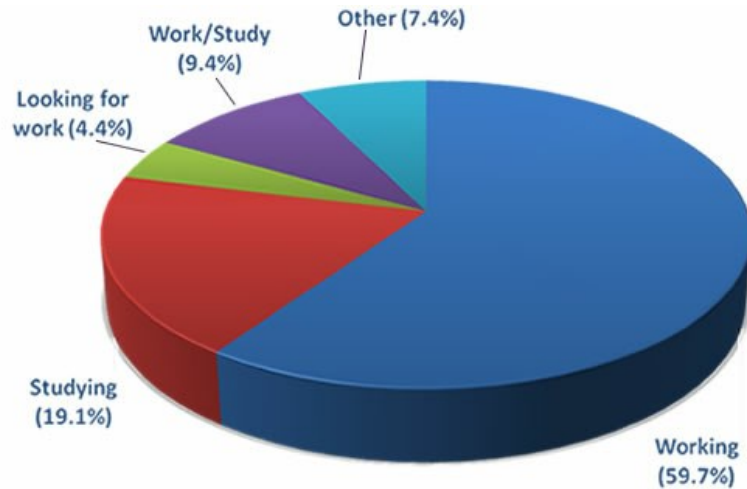


## Geography and Planning graduate career opportunities
