### Research

Dr Jones is a cultural geographer with a research focus in two linked areas: first understanding change in the urban environment, particularly urban regeneration; second examining questions around mobility, particularly how walking and cycling bodies engage with spaces. Bridging these areas is an interest in the city as both a manifestation of cultural activity and a space through which uniquely *urban* cultures are brought into being. His work is characterised by the development of innovative methodological approaches both in the collection of research materials and how research findings are communicated.
