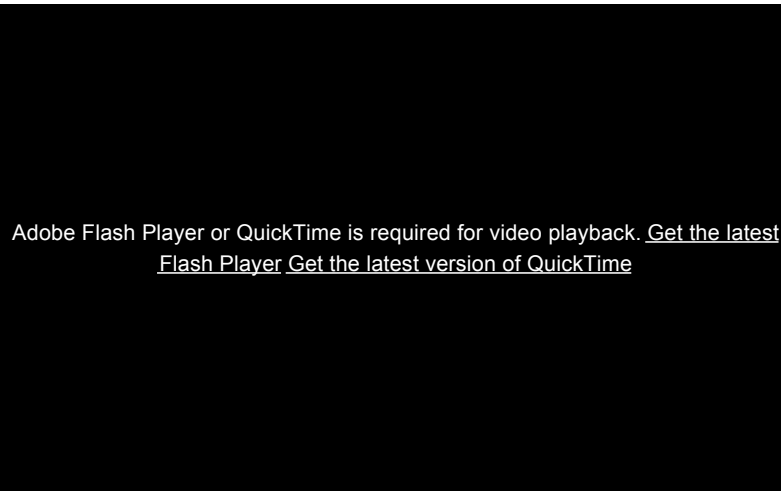


About us
