IDD's research activities challenge and contribute to contemporary debates in development studies and policy. Since 1968, IDD has been committed to research that is ground-breaking, interdisciplinary and policy-relevant. Our goals for our research are to challenge existing paradigms and to help shape theoretical and policy debates in development studies.

IDD has been known for many years for research on governance and development, with particular strengths in local government and corruption. In recent years, we have also developed strength in research on state-building and security, the relationship between [Religions and Development \(http://www.religionsanddevelopment.org/\)](http://www.religionsanddevelopment.org/), [Service delivery \(/schools/government-society/research/projects/idd/archive/service-providers.aspx\)](/schools/government-society/research/projects/idd/archive/service-providers.aspx), natural resource management and aid management. Our research is supported by a range of funders, especially the ESRC, British Academy, NERC, European Union, the UK Department for International Development (DFID) and other multilateral and bilateral aid agencies. It is presented to academic audiences all over the world, contributes to major international debates about development policy, links with our policy advisory work, and informs the education and training we offer.

IDD has an active research culture that has provided the bedrock on which we have established an international reputation as one of the UK's leading academic institutions in the field of development studies. Our students join an active research community, including both members of staff and other research students.
