## Why Study Collaborative Strategy?

Everyone in the public sector needs to understand why successful collaboration is crucial to success in transformation, cost reduction and improved outcomes. But it isn't easy. Each partner will have a different culture and different imperatives and you need to understand what drives them before you can work in partnership effectively. How can you harness the benefits and avoid the pitfalls of collaboration? This module gives you the tools to develop genuinely collaborative strategies, so that your partnerships deliver better outcomes at lower cost.

## Accreditation

## Who should attend?

This module is suitable for all public service managers and elected members and board members of public service organisations who have the remit to work in partnership on public services.
