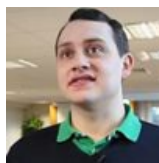

Alumni profiles in Sociology at Birmingham in the Department of Political Science and International Studies.



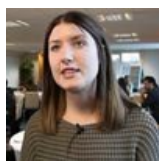
