The Study China Programme is a UK government-funded 17-day study programme in China. It's an opportunity to learn about China, its language and its culture, and it's open to undergraduates in England, Scotland and Northern Ireland. It includes the opportunity to visit China, take an intensive course in Chinese language and be immersed in Chinese cultural and social activities. The study programme gives students a chance to enhance employability skills. At the end of the programme Sylwia was offered an internship at China Economic Review.
