Biography

I have been a member of CREES since 2000, formerly as a PhD student and, since 2003 as a member of the academic staff.

My broad research interests are in the dynamics between power and opposition in authoritarian and semi-authoritarian regimes, democratisation in contemporary Europe and Russian domestic politics, particularly the evolution of the party system and specifically the development of the liberal-democratic and opposition forces.

My most recent research project, funded by the ESRC, analysed political opposition strategies to the Medvedev-Putin regime and involved two periods of fieldwork in Moscow involving interviews with leading opposition actors, party and civil society activists and political analysts. Given the unprecedented opposition protests in Russia following the parliamentary elections of December 2011, such research is certainly timely. In April 2013 I was awarded a small British Academy to continue this research.

Combined with my earlier PhD research on the Yabloko party I have developed a network of contacts with the Russian democratic opposition (broadly defined). Today's opposition, of course, may be tomorrow's political leaders, even in an electoral authoritarian system such as Russia!

I also contribute to the postgraduate module, 'Researching Russia and Eastern Europe' (G1)

Postgraduate supervision

I have supervised doctoral students on topics relating to the role of the Catholic Church in Russia, the role of the party of power in Russia, pro-Kremlin youth movements, official discourse on Chechnya, the role of youth movements in Georgia and Ukraine, political developments in Belarus (all successfully completed).

Recent Projects

ESRC 2-year project on the Future of Political Opposition in Russia's Managed Democracy (2009-2011). Award: £50,000

In 2011 I was awarded £2,250 in ASSC seed-corn funding for a project I am working on with Dr John Round (School of Geography, University of Birmingham and Higher School of Economics, Moscow) into the 'lived experience' of electoral authoritarianism in Russia. There has been some excellent research into attitudes towards democracy and authoritarianism in Russia and support for authoritarian forms of rule. This research aims to dig a little deeper and investigate the impact of Russia's political system (best conceptualised as what Andreas Schedler refers to as 'electoral authoritarianism') on the daily lives of its people. Once the preliminary findings of the project (which has involved a series of interviews and focus groups in Moscow and Kazan) have been analysed John and I intend to apply for further funding.

In 2010 I organised a conference on 'Party Politics in Russia' which was held in Birmingham in June 2010. The papers given at the conference will be published in a special issue (which I am guest-editing) of *East European Politics* (formerly the *Journal of Communist Studies and Transition Politics*) in 2011. Contributors include Richard Sakwa, Neil Robinson, Paul Chaisty, Sean Roberts, Luke March, Derek Hutcheson, Edwin Bacon and Maya Atwal and myself.

In April 2013 I was awarded a British Academy small grant to carry out further research on Russian political opposition which will involve a visit to Moscow in September 2013 to meet with activists involved in the anti-Putin protest movement.

Other activities

I have a particular concern for teaching quality issues reflected in my activities as CREES Head of Academic Programmes (2006-2011) and latterly as CREES Director of Learning and Teaching.

I am a member the Birmingham UCU branch committee and am a BUCU caseworker.
