Entry requirements

Undergraduate programmes

- 80% average at standard XII with 75% in English (CBSE, ISCE) other state boards may require 85%, a satisfactory LNAT and an IELTS of 7.0 or equivalent.

Postgraduate programmes

- A first class degree in a 3 or 5 year LLB programme from a recognised institution. Applications are also considered from students attaining a high upper second class degree. Students will also require an IELTS of 7.0 or equivalent.

Graduate-entry programmes

- An upper second class degree from a recognised institution in any subject area. Applications are also considered from students attaining a high upper second class degree. Applicants will also require an IELTS of 7.0 or equivalent.

Qualifying as a lawyer in India

Qualifying to practice Law in India is subject to the rules of the [Bar Council of India \(http://www.barcouncilofindia.org/\)](http://www.barcouncilofindia.org/) [BCI]. The BCI requires 12 Years of school education followed by five years of higher education including a recognised LLB programme. All students then need to clear the All India Bar Examination in order to practice law in India
