Entrance requirements

Undergraduate programmes

- Grades AAA at A-Level or 36 points in the IB alongside a satisfactory LNAT
- Students who have taken the Thanewiyah will require a foundation year in order to be considered for admission to the LLB programme.

Postgraduate programmes

- 3.0/4.0 GPA or 3.5/5.0 GPA or equivalent in an LLB degree from a recognised institution.

Graduate-entry programmes

- 3.0/4.0 GPA or 3.5/5.0 GPA or equivalent in any degree programme from a recognised institution.
