The University of Birmingham is one of the most popular British universities for Canadian students choosing to study law overseas. We currently have over 80 Canadian students studying in the Law School and hope to build on these numbers in future years.

The LLB and LLB for Graduates programmes are extremely popular course with Canadian Students. England and Canada share a Common Law heritage and much of what you will learn is similar to what is taught on Canadian Law programmes. We have also introduced a module in Canadian Constitutional Law specifically for our Canadian cohort. After completing their LLB many of our graduates decide to continue on to an LLM programme within the school.

Accreditation in Canada

Canadian students taking the LLB programmes will be required to sit a number of challenge exams when returning to Canada in order to fulfil the requirements set out by the Federation of Canadian Law Societies National Committee on Accreditation (NCA).

Most Canadian students from Birmingham choose to prepare for their challenge examinations through self-study where the NCA provide a syllabus and students study at home. Tests take place four times each year, in January, May, August and October, and are marked as pass/fail. Most students will complete their challenge exams within 6 months to a year after returning to Canada.

- Students completing the LLB for Graduates with a 2:2 or above (equivalent to a C in Canada) in all modules generally have to sit 7 challenge exams
- Graduate students completing the 3-year LLB programme with a 2:2 or above (equivalent to a C in Canada) in all modules generally have to sit 5 challenge exams. Students taking the 3-year LLB straight from high school will also have additional challenge exams set by the NCA.

Entrance requirements

Undergraduate programmes

- 85% average in grade 12 across a minimum of 6 subject areas alongside satisfactory performance in the LNAT.
- If there is no test centre within a reasonable distance we can offer an exemption from the LNAT. Please contact us at [Law-LLB@bham.ac.uk \(mailto:Law-LLB@bham.ac.uk\)](mailto:Law-LLB@bham.ac.uk) to request an exemption.

Postgraduate programmes (LLM)

- Average of a B+ in an LLB programme, we will also consider applicants who have achieved a B average or GPA of 3.0/4.

Graduate-entry programmes

- B+ average in any degree subject, this generally equates **o** (http://www.canadalawfromabroad.com/canadalawfromabroad/LLB_JD_Accreditation.html) to a 3.2/4 GPA and we are willing to consider applicants from students with a B average or GPA of 3.0/4.
