Entrance requirements

Undergraduate programmes

- Grades AAA in principal level subjects at Ugandan Advanced Certificate of Education (UACE) alongside a satisfactory LNAT

Postgraduate programmes

- 2:1 or equivalent in an LLB degree from a recognised institution which usually equates to a GPA of 3.5/5.0. We will also consider high 2:2 grades when supported by strong references.

Graduate-entry programmes

- 2:1 or equivalent in any degree programme from a recognised institution which usually equates to a GPA of 3.5/5.0. We will also consider high 2:2 grades when supported by strong references.
