

Birmingham Law Professor Gives Evidence to House of Lords

Professor Anthony Arnall, Barber Professor of Jurisprudence at Birmingham Law School, appeared before the **Justice and Institutions Sub-Committee of the House of Lords EU Committee** (<http://www.parliamentlive.tv/Main/MeetingDetails.aspx?meetingId=6688>) on 13 October 2010 to assist it with its enquiry into the working of the European Court of Justice.

In a meeting lasting over an hour, Professor Arnall discussed with the Sub-Committee a range of issues including filtering cases, the future of the preliminary rulings procedure, dealing with intellectual property cases, the language regime and case management.
