

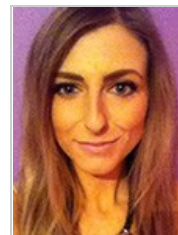

My thesis aims to critically assess the legality of the measures taken by the International Atomic Energy Agency and the United Nations Security Council in response to controversial Iranian uranium enrichment and contested non-compliance with the current Nuclear Counter-Proliferation legal framework, namely the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty 1968. Furthermore I intend to evaluate the effectiveness of the current regime and investigate the legality and desirability of introducing legislative and/or operational reform to strengthen the current Counter-Proliferation legal framework.
