1. Do you want to be fluent in one or more languages?

- **Modern Languages BA** (</undergraduate/courses/lang/modern-languages.aspx>). Get fluent in one, two or three languages, or combine one or two languages with modules in European Studies or Translation Studies.
- **Modern Languages with Business Management BA** (</undergraduate/courses/lang/mod-lang-business.aspx>). 1 or 2 languages with hands-on business skills.

Don't forget you can **start a new language from scratch**. You'll learn fast with our award-winning methods and you'll be fully fluent by final year.

Our core Modern Languages BA programme involves the study of either one, two or three modern languages in various weightings, each being either one third, one half, or two thirds of your total course load. You are permitted to shift these weightings from year to year. You have the chance to learn about culture alongside your language: **literature, history, film, politics, society, art**. You can also learn **translation skills**.
