

Ethics and Philosophy of Religion research cluster



The Philosophy department at Birmingham has a large number of talented researchers and PG students working on ethics and philosophy of religion. This research community forms a research cluster which is especially strong in three areas of research.

Firstly, we are very strong in applied ethics and especially in bioethics, global ethics, philosophy of health and happiness, and related areas in political philosophy. In this area, our department hosts **the Centre for the Study of Global Ethics** (</research/activity/gloalethics/index.aspx>), which is led by **Professor Heather Widdows** (</staff/profiles/philosophy/widdows-heather.aspx>). Other researchers who work in this area include **Professor Lisa Bortolotti** (</staff/profiles/philosophy/bortolotti-lisa.aspx>), **Dr Iain Law**

(</staff/profiles/philosophy/law-ian.aspx>), **Professor Yujin Nagasawa** (</staff/profiles/philosophy/nagasawa-yujin.aspx>) and **Dr Jeremy Williams** (</staff/profiles/philosophy/williams-jeremy.aspx>). Secondly, in philosophy of religion we host **the John Hick Centre** (</research/activity/philosophyofreligion/index.aspx>), which is one of the top research centres in the field in Europe. It is directed by **Dr David Cheetham** (</staff/profiles/tr/cheetham-david.aspx>) and **Professor Yujin Nagasawa** (</staff/profiles/philosophy/nagasawa-yujin.aspx>). Finally, we have also recently become strong in the area of metaethics through **Dr Jussi Suikkanen** (</staff/profiles/philosophy/suikkanen-jussi.aspx>), **Dr Alex Silk** (</staff/profiles/philosophy/silk-alex.aspx>) and Distinguished Research Professors **Paul Boghossian** (</staff/profiles/philosophy/boghossian-paul.aspx>) and **Ralph Wedgwood** (</staff/profiles/philosophy/wedgwood-ralph.aspx>).

Some research topics that are of particular interest to the cluster include:

In bioethics, global ethics and philosophy of health and happiness:

- Healthcare ethics
- The relationship between the pathological and the irrational
- Philosophical theories of well-being and happiness

- Divine attributes
- Science and religion
- The existence of God

In Metaethics:

- Moral epistemology and especially debunking arguments
- Forms of moral realism: naturalism vs. non-naturalism
- Semantics of normative language and deontic modals
- Moral psychology and motivation
- Moral truth and objectivity

Professor Paul Boghossian (<http://www.birmingham.ac.uk/staff/profiles/philosophy/boghossian-paul.aspx>) is one of the Distinguished Research Professors at Birmingham. One of his research interests is different forms of subjectivism, relativism and anti-realism in metaethics.

Professor Lisa Bortolotti (<http://www.birmingham.ac.uk/staff/profiles/philosophy/bortolotti-lisa.aspx>)'s primary research interests are in the philosophy of cognitive sciences (with a special focus on psychology and psychiatry) and in the biomedical ethics. She has written extensively on topics such as mental health, the meaning of life, reproductive autonomy, research ethics and moral responsibility.

Dr Justin Clarke-Doane (<http://www.birmingham.ac.uk/staff/profiles/philosophy/clarke-doane-justin.aspx>) is a Birmingham Fellow. In ethics he is especially interested in moral epistemology and debunking arguments, on which he has published widely.

Dr Iain Law (<http://www.birmingham.ac.uk/staff/profiles/philosophy/law-ian.aspx>) is a Senior Lecturer in philosophy currently working on papers in moral theory, moral psychology, the philosophy of medicine and applied ethics.

Professor Yujin Nagasawa (<http://www.birmingham.ac.uk/staff/profiles/philosophy/nagasawa-yujin.aspx>) specialises in the philosophy of religion, the philosophy of mind and applied philosophy. In philosophy of religion, he is interested in the existence of God, traditional conceptions of God and its alternatives, divine attributes, the problem of evil and science and religion. He also has an interest in medical ethics, the meaning of life and death.

Dr Alex Silk (<http://www.birmingham.ac.uk/staff/profiles/philosophy/silk-alex.aspx>) is a lecturer in Philosophy. One of his areas of specialization is metaethics and especially the meaning of normative language. He has published on truth-conditions for ethical terms, the semantics of deontic modals and other areas related to metaethics.

Dr Jussi Suikkanen (<http://www.birmingham.ac.uk/staff/profiles/philosophy/suikkanen-jussi.aspx>)'s (lecturer in Philosophy) main research interests are in metaethics and normative ethics. In these areas, he has published articles on the nature of moral properties and judgments, and also on ethical theories such as contractualism and

consequentialism.

Dr Mark Walker (<http://www.birmingham.ac.uk/staff/profiles/philosophy/walker-mark.aspx>) is a lecturer in Philosophy whose principle research interests are the philosophy of mind, Kant's moral philosophy and metaphysics. He also has an interest in philosophy of religion and especially the divine command theories of morality.

Professor Ralph Wedgwood (<http://www.birmingham.ac.uk/staff/profiles/philosophy/wedgwood-ralph.aspx>) is one the Distinguished Research Professors at Birmingham. His main research interests in ethics are in the fundamental questions of metaethics and in topics related to practical reason and rationality. He also has an interested in many topics in applied ethics including the doctrine of double effect and marriage.

Professor Heather Widdows (<http://www.birmingham.ac.uk/staff/profiles/philosophy/widdows-heather.aspx>) works on global ethics, virtue ethics and feminist theory as well as biomedical issues, particularly those of reproductive, research and genetic ethics.

Dr Jeremy Williams (<http://www.birmingham.ac.uk/staff/profiles/philosophy/williams-jeremy.aspx>) is a Birmingham Fellow. He works in moral and political philosophy. Currently he is working on a book on public justification and ethics. He has published various articles on the ethical questions related to abortion.
