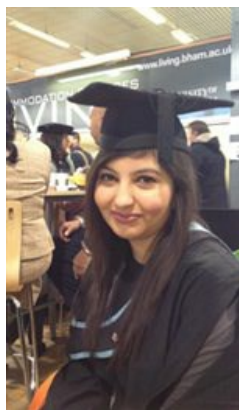


Naila Begum, BA Social Policy
